

UK – New Zealand Trade DealHow the South East benefits

Top benefits:



Automotive companies in the South East that exported £26.3m of vehicles to New Zealand last year will benefit from the removal of up to 10% tariffs.



The removal of tariffs of up to 5%, alongside streamlined customs and border procedures, will also help manufacturers that exported £14.8m of machinery to New Zealand last year.



Wine producers like **Gusbourne Estate** will see tariffs of up to 5% on wine removed, making their products more competitive in the New Zealand market.



Businesses in the South East that exported £3.4m of food products to New Zealand last year will benefit from the removal of 5% tariffs on various food products including chocolate, biscuits, and crisps.

Top facts

- » 1,125 businesses in the South East exported £76m of goods to New Zealand in 2020.
- » 8,000 jobs in the South East automotive industry were supported by exports in 2016, with the region exporting £26.3m of road vehicles to New Zealand last year.
- » Southampton is the UK's busiest port for exports to New Zealand, transporting more than £186m of goods last year.
